### What is the role?

The Programme Manager supports the Director of Programmes and education team and drives projects forward in coordination with the respective teams and senior management ensuring successful delivery within budgetary constraints.

### Responsibilities

- Co-ordinating and administering all aspects of our flagship programme Drive for Literacy (DfL);
- Supporting education team and DfL facilitators to deliver DfL by providing high-quality programme and admin support;
- Capturing and analysing management information on the delivery of programmes, projects and recurrent activities across the organisation;
- Supporting office administration working closely with the Operations Manager
- Supporting DYT to deliver high quality projects, events and training
- Other duties as directed by the Director of Programmes.

### What will the team look like?

You will be working at the heart of DYT, primarily with the education team and facilitators, and supporting the wider work of organisation, and Senior Leadership Team (SLT)

### What's the context?

DYT is a growing organisation. This means that:

- You will be aligned to our vision and mission;
- The team will grow steadily over the next three years and you will have the opportunity to shape and adapt your role with the organisation;
